Virtual Lunch Debate at the European Parliament on 1 March 2023

Brussels, Belgium, March 2023. The Third of March is World Hearing Day. On this day each year, the World Health Organization (WHO) raises awareness about the need for better hearing health worldwide. This year, WHO has chosen the slogan "Ear and Hearing Care for All!" for the event.

In Europe, the World Hearing Day campaign kicks off on the 1st of March with the annual Virtual Lunch Debate at the European Parliament, an event jointly organized by EHIMA and its partners AEA, EFHOH and EURO-CIU.

In 2023, the debate focuses on the importance of preventing hearing loss and improving hearing care. The event is being hosted by MEP David Lega (Sweden, EPP) who will be joined by Shelly Chadha (WHO), Mark Laureyns (AEA), Lidia Best (EFHOH), Teresa Amat (EURO-CIU), Patrick D'Haese (EHIMA) and Ariane Laplante-Lévesque (WHO Europe).
